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Introduction

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Regulatory Branch, implements Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act:

- 1. Regulates the placement of any structure or work in, under, or over a "traditionally navigable water".
- 2. Regulates the discharge of *dredged* or *fill material* into "waters of the U.S."

Agency Programs

- 1. The Corps' role is regulatory in nature; therefore, we do not have any special programs.
- 2. Role in Watershed Management: The goal of the Corps regulatory authority is to facilitate navigation, and to avoid, minimize and mitigate physical impacts to waters of the United States.

Watershed Plan Engagement Opportunities

- 1. Address physical (habitat) impacts
- 2. Avoidance & minimization
- 3. Permittee-responsible mitigation
- 4. In-lieu fee mitigation
