The Oldham County Fiscal Court convened at a regular meeting at 2:00 p.m. with Judge-Executive David Voegele, County Attorney John Carter, and the following Magistrates in attendance: Brent Likins, Wayne Theiss, Albert Harrison, Steve Greenwell, Chris Haunz, Stephanie Hawkins, Bob Dye, and Michael Logsdon.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Motion made by Magistrate Dye and seconded by Magistrate Greenwell to approve the agenda as submitted adding *Donation of Ambulance*. Motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The meeting minutes from February 4, 2020 were read and unanimously approved.

COMMUNITY BUSINESS:

2nd Reading/Public Hearing - Zoning Map Amendment for 5900 W. Highway 146, Crestwood

Senior Planner, Tom McIntyre, presented for second reading proposed Ordinance No. KOC 20-920-34 relating to a change in the Oldham County Zoning Map rezoning 0.63 acres of a tract located at 5900 W. Highway 146, Crestwood from the existing CO-1 Conservation/Residential District Zoning and I-1 Light Industrial District Zoning to C-3 General Business District Zoning Classification.

Beach Craigmyle, Attorney representing the applicant, Wayne Abbott, provided an introduction and testimony in support of the proposed zoning map amendment.

David Garber, Garber-Chilton Engineers & Land Surveyors, 2249 Commerce Pkwy, LaGrange, was sworn to provide testimony in behalf of this application.

No one spoke in opposition of the proposed zoning map amendment.

Fiscal Court asked questions of the applicant and staff. Beach Craigmyle, Wayne Abbott (after being sworn), and Staff Members responded to questions and provided additional testimony. Discussion continued.

Motion made by Magistrate Logsdon and seconded by Magistrate Hawkins to adopt Ordinance No. KOC 20-920-34 relating to a change in the Oldham County Zoning Map rezoning 0.63 acres of a tract located at 5900 W. Highway 146, Crestwood from the existing CO-1 Conservation/Residential District Zoning and I-1 Light Industrial District Zoning to C-3 General Business District Zoning Classification, to include the approved binding elements as recorded in the December 17, 2019 Planning Commission meeting minutes, for the same reasons provided by the Planning Commission; because it complies with objectives of the comprehensive plan, the existing zoning classification is inappropriate and the proposed zoning is appropriate, and there have been major changes of an economic, physical, or social nature within the area involved which were not anticipated in the adopted comprehensive plan and which have substantially altered the basic character of such area. Fiscal Court added an additional binding element requiring the owner to add a drainage easement for safety concerns, which was included in the motion. Exhibit #4 2/18/20. Discussion followed.

Motion carried 7 to 2 on a roll call vote. Judge Voegele and the following magistrates voted yes; Likins, Greenwell, Haunz, Hawkins, Dye, and Logsdon. Magistrates Theiss and Harrison voted no.

Motion made by Magistrate Theiss and seconded by Magistrate Greenwell to take a five minute recess. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion made by Magistrate Dye and seconded by Magistrate Logsdon to return to the meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

2nd Reading/Public Hearing – Zoning Map Amendment for 5500 Block of Shuler Lane, Prospect

Assistant Director of Planning & Development Amy Alvey presented for second reading proposed Ordinance KOC 20-920-32 relating to a change in the Oldham County Zoning Map rezoning 34.86 acres of a tract located at the 5500 Block of Schuler Lane, Prospect from the existing AG-1 Agricultural/Residential District Zoning to R-2 Residential District Zoning Classification.

Attorney John Talbott representing the applicant, Elite Homes, provided an introduction and testimony in support of the proposed zoning map amendment.

Fiscal Court asked questions of the applicant and staff who responded to questions and provided additional testimony. Discussion followed.

Motion made by Magistrate Dye and seconded by Magistrate Haunz to adopt Ordinance No. KOC 20-920-32 relating to a change in the Oldham County Zoning Map rezoning 34.86 acres of a tract located at the 5500 Block of Schuler Lane, Prospect from the existing AG-1 Agricultural/Residential District Zoning to R-2 Residential District Zoning Classification, to include the approved binding elements as recorded in the December 17, 2019 Planning Commission meeting minutes, for the same reasons provided by the Planning Commission; *because it complies with objectives of the comprehensive plan and future Land Use Map.* Fiscal Court added an additional binding element of "No construction vehicles for deliveries shall use Moser Farm Road, Laurel Lane, Worthington Lane, or Haunz Lane to access this development", which was included in the motion. **Exhibit #5 2/18/20.** Discussion followed.

Motion carried 8 to 1 on a roll call vote. Judge Voegele and the following magistrates voted yes; Likins, Theiss, Harrison, Greenwell, Haunz, Dye, and Logsdon. Magistrate Hawkins voted no.

Motion made by Judge Voegele and seconded by Magistrate Likins to appoint Damien Baird to the Tourism Commission with a term to expire 3/2/2022, filling the unexpired term of Donna Sabo, who resigned. **Exhibit #8 2/18/20.** Motion carried unanimously.

Emergency Management Services Director Jerry Nauert announced the Division of Forestry has set burn restrictions during the Spring Forest Fire Hazard Season; February 15th through April 30th; it is illegal to burn between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. within 150 feet of any woodland or brush land.

Magistrate Harrison stated 2/19 is Coast Guard Reserve birthday. Announced the Ohio River's water level is going down.

Magistrate Likins announced Legislative Training Day in Frankfort is February 20th and most Fiscal Court members are attending.
